Fluent English Speakers With or Without

Teaching Experience

Almost any person who is a fluent English speaker may qualify to teach English as a Foreign Language. Yes, this means second-language English speakers may also teach English. For example, public schools in Colombia are currently accepting fluent, nonnative English speakers from any country into their program which is an initiative by the Colombian government to help Colombia to become bilingual.

English Teachers With Accredited Certification

TEFL, TESOL or CELTA certification qualifies an English teacher for more job opportunities in the global market. Certified teachers can also expect higher wage prospects. This specialized training can also help a college graduate gain specific skills that will enhance existing abilities.

College Graduates

Many countries of Western Europe, Asia and the Persian Gulf require a college degree in order to teach English in their country. In many cases, this degree doesn't need to be in teaching. Often any degree will do.



TEFL/ TESOL/ CELTA

Most European countries require TEFL, TESOL or CELTA certification in order to teach English in their country. Such certifications are also helpful in finding jobs in other countries, such as Latin American countries. These programs provide training in order to teach English professionally in a foreign country. Any person looking for an English teaching job abroad, with or without a college degree, can gain tremendous benefit from the skills learned in these certification programs.

In order to be optimally prepared as a professional teacher abroad and enjoy the benefit of more opportunities as you job seek, we recommend accredited TEFL or TESOL certifications with a minimum of 100 hours of course work.

When determining which course to enroll in, consider that the following standards will be met by programs that are legitimately accredited:

- Minimum of 100 hours of coursework
- Accreditation awarded by a reputable, outside agency or body
- Qualified course instructor
- Instructor has ESL teaching experience abroad

If you plan to enroll in an online certification program, look for a direct link on the website that will navigate to the accrediting body's website. Research the accrediting body's history. All certification programs offered by TEFL UK are fully accredited through ACCREDITAT.



The First Step

The first step after studying your TEFL course is research. What countries are you interested in? Study the requirements of TEFL teachers in several countries you are interested in.

Read testimonials of other foreign teachers or, if possible, have a conversation with them about their own personal experiences teaching abroad.

About the Interview

When you have an interview planned, the first impression you should make is that you are reliable. In other words, be on time.

Whether the interview is over the phone, in person or via Skype, be punctual. Also make sure you are certain how Skype is formatted so that a webcam interview runs smoothly from start to finish. It is also possible you may have multiple interviews. Verify scheduling and stay organized so times and dates do not get mixed up. Be aware of time zone differences.

Put forth a positive image, relax and smile when you greet your interviewer. Consider the possibility that the interviewer may not be a native English speaker. Speak clear, concise and unhurried. Dress professionally even if the interview is through a medium such as Skype.

Knowledge of basic customs, languages, and religious practices will indicate to an interviewer that you are serious about teaching in their country. Learning a traditional greeting in the native language of the interviewer can also express a measure of enthusiasm an interviewer can see as positive.

An interview is also the teacher's first opportunity to ask directly about the job they have applied for. Understand that if accepted, you may be signing a one-year or longer teaching contract. Don't be afraid to ask questions to help you understand if the job will meet your own expectations. Find out rudimentary details about curriculum and students. This can signal to the interviewer the level of seriousness with which you consider this potential job.

Be prepared to express your reasons for wanting to teach English abroad. You may also be expected to explain why you have chosen a particular country. Questions regarding your training and experience will most certainly be interview questions and should be thoughtfully answered.



















Colombia




Argentina

Argentina is like a sexy cocktail of culture, natural wonders, city life and cuisine. It's the land of fútbol, music, arts and the sensual tango. Cafés in Buenos Aires are filled with stylish porteños, surrounded by stunning early 20th century stone facades. Some fun can be had exploring the beautiful countryside that contributes to the appeal of teaching in Argentina. From wine country to climbing glaciers, the geographical diversity of Argentina offers great enjoyment for an English teacher abroad.

TEFL certification is not necessary to teach English in Argentina, however it will improve job prospects. Most teachers average about four to five classes daily. The best time to start a job hunt in Argentina is shortly before the school year begins in March. Most English teachers find employment among the Language Institutes of Argentina.

The growth of Argentina's economy translates into growing cities with businesses in need of English speaking employees. Such needs mean Argentina is ready for your English teaching skills right now.





India

The sights, sounds and smells assault the senses and effectively scramble the brain at first glance. Learn yoga where it originated, visit hundreds of temples, take in the stunning beauty and lavishness of the Taj Mahal, sun yourself on golden southern India beaches and witness the lure of the Ganges.

The Golden Triangle of Delhi, Jaipur and Agra offer plenty to see on this well-worn tourist track but there is plenty of opportunity to head off the beaten path with visits to sultry Kerala, camp under the stars on a desert safari, take a plantation tour and see where India's tea is grown or find serenity in one of the many Tibetan Buddhist communities.

Some schools may require a Bachelor's Degree but an English teacher should still be able to find a job with TEFL or TESOL certification. You may also complete an internship in India to obtain practical experience with your TEFL certificate. During the internship you may be given free Hindi classes, free accommodation and a living allowance.






South Korea

South Korea is a land where modern life meets history. Skyscrapers tower over ancient temples, the frenzied pace of the city is balanced by the serenity of nature. Unique customs and tricky etiquette may trump some visitors up but Korea is home to some of the friendliest people on earth.

One of the sources of Korea's great appeal is that it offers some of the highest paying English teaching jobs. Full aid is usually given to assist teachers in getting their E-2 working visa. Free furnished housing is also provided, adding to the benefits of teaching in Korea. It is also common for employers to contribute to a teacher's medical insurance. Work hours are typically about 30 hours, five or six days weekly, leaving plenty of time to enjoy yourself as a tourist.

A Bachelor's degree is a requirement for the E-2 visa, as well as being a citizen of one of the seven biggest English-speaking countries in the world - South Africa, United Kingdom, Ireland, United States of America, New Zealand, Canada and Australia. With an overall low cost of living and a good salary, it's hard not to consider Korea as a teacher's country of choice.





Nepal

Nepal is known as "the roof of the world", where snow-capped, Himalayan peaks disappear into the clouds like Mt. Everest standing at a lofty 8,848 meters. It is the birthplace of Gautama Buddha and millions of pilgrims visit the temple complex at Lumbini, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, where Buddha once lived. Kathmandu is a bustling city with Westernstyle bars and Chinese and Indian influences in its food and architecture.

Teaching in Nepal is almost like being transported to a magical kingdom. Extreme geographical diversity and some of the tallest mountains in the world form the backdrop no matter where you teach in Nepal. You can find your own personal Shangri-la teaching English in Nepal!

Although a college degree is not required to teach in Nepal, it is highly recommended to be properly prepared with TEFL or TESOL certification. Teaching schedule expectations can range from 15 hours weekly to 40 hours.






Thailand

Thailand attracts a myriad of visitors as diverse as the nation itself. From backpacking hostelers to billionaire businessmen living it up in five-star palaces, there is something for every budget and type of traveler. Thailand is known for its hospitality, ancient temple ruins, floating markets, tropical islands and glorious beaches. It's a place for scuba divers, rock climbers, hikers, trekkers and wildlife enthusiasts. Thai cuisine is world-renowned and is offered abundantly from night markets, street stalls and fine-dining restaurants.

Thailand offers competitive teaching salaries paired with a relatively low cost of living. To qualify for a teaching job in Thailand, you must have a Bachelor's degree or a TEFL certification. A typical work-week is 40 hours and five days. Other benefits for teachers in Thailand are usually a housing allowance and health insurance.

TEFL internships in Thailand do not always require a degree or nationality of a native English speaking country.





Taiwan

Taiwan is an incredible mix of high-tech, big city and ancient cultural and religious practices co-habitating in harmony together. Futuristic skyscrapers share the city of Taipei with temples and indigenous peoples. The cuisine is a blend of Chinese, Japanese and aboriginal influences. The valleys, lakes and gorges of the countryside are a draw for hikers, cyclists, surfers and divers alike.

With a first-world economy, there is high demand for English teachers. This translates into good pay as well as a good standard of living. Legal alien residents also enjoy the benefit of universal health coverage. There are very few tourists which leaves areas open to discover without the crowds.

TEFL certification is not always required but can be very helpful in landing some of the better opportunities. Higher paid positions are often found in private tutoring, universities, or teaching at kindergarten level.





Vietnam

Travel to Vietnam has increased exponentially over the past decade. Bustling cities filled with street vendors and buzzing mopeds give way to beautiful islands and beaches. Life in the two main cities, Hanoi and Ho Chi Minh, is frenetic and full of pulsing energy with modern skyscrapers, ancient temples, narrow streets and market stalls. The beautiful countryside offers postcard perfect scenery and cultural diversity. Cruise the islands of Halong Bay, visit the palaces in beautiful Hue or bask in the sun on golden beaches in Nha Trang.

Employers usually offer visa sponsorship as well as helping a teacher obtain the necessary work permit and document renewals. Along with four weeks of vacation, teachers often enjoy other benefits such as housing assistance, four weeks for sick leave, and a supportive work environment. Preferred qualifications are: native English speaker, Bachelor's degree, TEFL certification with at least 100 hours of course material, and some teaching experience.





Japan

Japan is a mix of the traditional and the modern. It is one of the most technologically advanced countries in the world yet it still retains ancient customs and traditions. It is most certainly unique. There are palaces, Buddhist temples, Shinto shrines, Kabuki, gardens, historical landmarks and more. Visit beautiful Kyoto, one of Japan's best-preserved cities, having escaped much of the destruction in World War II. Ski in Hokkaido, swim in the turquoise waters of Okinawa or climb Mt. Fuji. 
Another practical approach is to have a routine. This will create a sense of stability when everything else around you might feel strange.

Homesickness

When you pack for your trip, take a few things from home to use in your new accommodations. Settle in and create a comfortable space that reflects who you are. Most importantly, keep busy. Don't just sit around the house. The therapeutic benefits of physical exercise are proven. As you become more integrated into your new community, make friends. Relationships provide critical emotional nurturing that every human being needs.







Documents:

- Most importantly, take your important documents such as passport, birth certificate, visa, and teaching credentials. Take along an extra copy of each and extra passport photos as well.
- Airline tickets and itinerary, a copy of each is a good idea, along with a contact list of family, friends, legal counsel, native country embassy
- Health insurance policy, emergency contact list, contact list for physicians, medical history, list of any prescriptions currently prescribed, proof of vaccinations
- Criminal background check
- International driver's license (if you have one)

Everyday Items:

- Credit cards, Traveler's checks, copies of each, cash, wallet
- Spare eyeglasses, copy of lens prescription
- Appropriate work attire
- Suitable clothing for the climate of the host country for everyday wear, dress up occasions, and excursions Personal hygiene and toiletries items
- Electrical adapter for electrical items such as hair dryer, laptop, etc.



Special Items:

- Personal items, such as photo album or sentimental knick-knacks Leisure and luxury items such as music player, books, etc.
 Camera, charger, and batteries
- Things from your country to give as gifts
- Special non-perishable food items
